## PROJECTS:

### 1. CYDD Contemporary Activity Centers

The decision to open cultural activity centers were taken in 2012 by unanimous vote of all CYDD branches.

The cultural activity centers are planned as regional centers where disadvantaged children and young people and their families benefit free of charge with the services of CYDD members and volunteers, where they can learn and develop together. They are either an annex building to a branch or a unit of a branch.

24 Cultural activity centers were put into practice by end 2018.

On February 9,2018,the managers of the activity centers attended the meeting on the development of activity centers and decided;

- ✓ 40% of programs should be common and standard and 60% should be regional and according to the facilities
- ✓ Establishment of a ÇYDD Activity Center Children's Choir
- ✓ Reorganization of Directive on the Activity Centers
- ✓ Establishment of corporate e-mail addresses for the centers

Projects implemented in the Activity Centers

- ✓ Hand-in-Hand with women (in collaboration with ICF ),
- ✓ Hand-in-Hand with high school girls (in collaboration with ICF ),
- ✓ "Kodlamaca" Computer coding (managed by CYDD headquarters),
- ✓ AÇEV Projects ( literacy courses for parents)
- ✓ Arts and sports activities such as handicraft,theater, ballet, folk dances,guitar, "bağlama" rhythm exercises,choral and orchestral creation, swimming
- ✓ Support lessons for school work on subjects such as turkish, sciences, math and english.

## 2.Scholarship projects

Scholarship projects carried out in two separate units, high school and university, in June 2017 were combined into a single unit under the umbrella of the Scholarship Unit with the aim of integrity in operation. The Scholarship unit reorganized the scholarship directive by organizing two workshops in March and September 2018 with the participation of branches. Within the framework of the joint decisions taken at the workshops, the amount and duration of scholarships between the branches and the Headquarters were equalized. The conditions for granting scholarships were revised. It was decided to increase the scholarship amounts by 10% per year in all projects.

As of September 2017, the scholarship computer program was opened for use with all branches. Of the 1,200 students who graduated from high school, 18% entered a university and continue as a scholarship student. Our high school graduates make up 20% of our total university students.

We have started to give graduate scholarships in 2015. In 2017 27 and in 2018 38 students received graduate scholarships from the Cydd Headquarters. 4 of these students receive scholarships from Cydd since high school.

We have started on line application for university scholarships in 2017. There were 22,000 applications in 2017 and 31,000 in 2018.

With the university scholarship Project that started with 500 students in 1995, **35,350** university students graduated with Cydd scholarships. We have given scholarships to **73,914** secondary school and highschool students with the support of individual and corporate donors since 1997.

### 3. Mentorship project



The ÇYDD Mentorship Program has been running since 2012 to support the personal and career development of university students who receive scholarships from CYDD.

Mentors continue their one-on-one meetings with mentees within the framework of the rules determined and also receive personal and Professional development trainings organized within the scope of the Project. Such as Curriculum Vitae preparation, Interview Techniques, Effective Presentation Skills, Career Planning, Introduction to Business Life. We encourage our young people to become prepared and competitive individuals before starting work.

#### 4. Hand in hand with Women

The Project is being carried out jointly with the support of UPKD/ICF. The “Hand in Hand with Women” project run by ICF volunteer coaches make 6 sessions of group coaching with women who have a key role in raising modern youth. The aim of the sessions is to raise awareness of women of different ages and educational levels on issues such as communication with children, culture of appreciation, self- confidence and coping with life.



The Project was run 29 times in 24 different locations in 12 cities. 390 women and 38 coaches took part in the sessions.

In the panel held on occasion of 8 March 2017 International Women's day, the participant women shared their gains from the coaching work.

## 5. Hand in hand with youth

The Project is being run with ICF since 2007 and 997 students were given coaching by 597 coaches.

The program provides support to young people's personal development, to cope with problems they face in Daily life, to determine their goals more clearly and to develop self-confidence.

## 8. KODLAMACA Computer Coding

The Project aims to create free minds and encourage children to be producers and not only consumers in the digital world, supports creative and analytical thinking by teaching them computer coding methods.

The Project aims to benefit financially disadvantaged children studying in grades 4-5-6-7-8 in public schools. The projects is supported by financial and computer donations of individuals and corporations. The Project was run in 58 locations in 23 towns by 2018.



## 9. ÜYEP – Back to education



With this Project child workers below 16 years of age are withdrawn from the working environment and are sent back to school.

To compensate for academic and social skill deficiencies that may arise from children starting to work at an early age, artistic, sporting activities, guidance and psychological support activities are also provided. The child's salary is paid to the family from the Project budget in order to prevent the family suffering from the loss of child's salary. The ÜYEP Project which started in March 2013, brought 102 child workers back to education.

## 10.EDUC<sup>∞</sup> project



### **English immersion Project for the empowerment of young women:**

The university student who are included in the program study language for one month in London or New York and improve their English speaking skills.

With the cultural experiences involved, the program will open up the horizons of girls as well as improving their English and enable them to think bigger and positively influence other people in their lives.

The girls accepted to the program are chosen among CYDD scholarship university girls in their 2nd or 3rd years in the university and with an intermediate knowledge of English.

With this Project in 2017 four girls and in 2018 four girls were sent to London where they also spent time with English speaking volunteers and career mentors, visited museums and went to concerts, musicals and theater shows.



## 11.ERASMUS+ (EVS) EUROPEAN VOLUNTARY SERVICE

Youth Exchange and European Voluntary Service (EVS) which are the sub-headings of the Erasmus+ Program of the Ministry of European Union, have been going on for a long time in our association.

Our association has accreditation as a sending organization in EVS. AS a result, an increasing number of young people have the opportunity to work voluntarily on a wide range of projects in various long-term or short-term European projects.



### 2017-2018: Programs and participating students

In July 2017, three of our students went to Netherlands to work together with students from 16 countries.

In June 2018, four of our students went to Netherlands to work together with students from 18 countries.

## 12.Step by Step –Run for Good

The Run for Good Project is a charity run web platform for volunteers who want to run for NGO projects supported by Step by Step. It is the first digital resource creation platform in the world designed only for fundraising by charity running.

CYDD joined the platform for the first time in 2018 and volunteers ran to fundraise for our highschool scholarship Project "I have a daughter in Anatolia". 262 people from among our members from our branches, volunteers and CYDD youth ran for education of girls. Funds raised by members of our branches were transferred to the bran
